## Pacific Boulevard Beautification Project

In 2014, the City of Huntington Park was awarded a \$2.7 million grant for streetscape improvements. The project area for the proposed streetscape improvements will be along Pacific Boulevard between Florence Avenue and Slauson Avenue. The proposed improvements will bring new life to the City's downtown with the addition of innovative trash receptacles, attractive street signage, lighting, and water-efficient landscaping that will make the downtown area a great walking experience.

## Community Development in Huntington Park

The Community Development Department has been working very hard to attract and retain businesses and services to the City. Our Economic Development Division works with developers, businesses and service providers to locate into the City, assists in developing their projects, and assists them through our development process. Our Planning Division assists in the permit process and further refines the project to meet the City's regulations. The City is pleased to introduce a few projects from the Community Development Team that you will be seeing in the very near future.



#### Public Charter School & 36 Affordable Housing Units 6100 Carmelita Avenue

The City is preparing for the construction and operation of a new two-story 34,280 square-foot public charter school facility. The new facility will seat a maximum of 400 students in grades K-5 and includes a 36-unit affordable housing apartment building that will provide affordable rental housing opportunities for teachers and staff of the school, as well as the general public. The housing project will consist of twelve 600 square-foot one bedroom units, twelve 897 square-foot two bedroom units and twelve 1,114 square-foot three bedroom units.



#### Mixed-Use Commercial/ Medical Office Center. 3111 Florence Avenue

The proposed project is at the site of the former Mission Hospital, which has been vacant for several years. A two-story building is proposed along the north end of the site and includes 9,782 square feet of retail space on the ground floor and 10,182 square feet of medical office space on the second floor. The project also proposes a 2,837 square foot building at the southwest corner of the site and a 3,064 square foot building at the southeast corner of the site for retail uses.

#### Huntington Park Beautifies Pacific Boulevard

The City of Huntington Park has obtained \$242,704.00 in competitive grant funding from CalRecycle to purchase and install solar powered dual recycling and trash compactor receptacles. Most of these high tech containers will be placed on Pacific Blvd. so that commuters and shoppers can conveniently recycle

beverage containers. Acquisition and installation of these receptacles is but one component of the plan to revitalize Pacific Blvd. The grant requires an installation no later than December 31, 2016, but the exact installation date has yet to be determined. "We are very excited to install these state-of-the-art containers and I believe installation will provide an opportunity that shoppers, commuters and businesses have been waiting for", says Claude Bilodeau, Superintendent of Public Works.

## Police Tips For Local Businesses



The Huntington Park Police Department strives to maintain a safe environment for your business to thrive and succeed. We engage in ongoing efforts to maintain open communication and a close working relationship with our business community. We want everyone to be aware of recent incidents so you can guard against unlawful activity that may target you.

Unknown individuals are calling businesses throughout the city claiming they are members of local street gangs and prison gangs. These individuals then make demands for money in exchange for protection and assurance your business will not be harmed. These individuals then offer instructions on how payments can be electronically wired to them.

We believe these extortion efforts are scams and the individuals are simply looking for easy targets. However, these calls are of serious concerns and we ask our business community to consider the following:

#### Don't be a victim of extortion

- Be cautious of calls made from an outside area code, (out of state or out of the country).
- Be cautious of repeated suspicious phone calls.
- Be cautious of callers attempting to keep you on the phone for a length of time.
- Be cautious of callers asking personal or irrelevant questions.
- Be cautious of callers demanding money in exchange for protection.

#### If you receive a suspicious phone call:

- Stay calm and slow the situation down.
- Avoid staying on the phone with the caller.
- Avoid sharing personal information about yourself or others.
- Don't send money to the caller.
- Dial 911 or immediately notify police.

## City of Huntington Park Water Conservation Restrictions

## Effective June 1, 2015 until rescinded by Council.



• Water landscape Mondays and Thursdays before 6 a.m. or after 6 p.m.

- No watering sidewalks, alleys or driveways.
- Wash car with a bucket of water and an automatic shutoff nozzle on the hose.
- No use of decorative water fountains or ponds.
- Repair leaky faucets.
- Glasses of water at restaurants by request only.
- Hotels and motels must offer option of not laundering linens and towels.
- No outside watering within 48 hours of measurable rain.

By following these restrictions, you will help us do our part in saving water during this time of shortage.
